Reading: DCF Books Abound

The fifth grade has been given a treat - bins of Dorothy Canfield Fisher books to read and share in our classroom. Ask your child about their favorite or the one they are hoping to read this year.

Writing: Writing Partners

Students have begun conferring with their partners to elevate their level of narrative writing. Kids benefit greatly from having a consistent partner that they can turn to when they have a question, or need an new idea. Writing partners not only help with revisions and improvements, but also celebrations!

Word Work: Long Vowel Sounds

We have been on a hunt for words that use vowel pairs to create the long vowel sound - ea, ai, ee, ay, oa, ue, and even some oddballs like ow and ew. We have also discovered that there are exceptions to every rule, like "ocean" and "said." We will continue fun word games and hunts throughout the year.

- Mathematicians have deepened their thinking about the equal sign to understand that it symbolizes balance between the value of the expressions on either side, rather than "here's the answer." Ask them if they can explain it to you, so they work on articulating with clarity and precision!
- November Number Corner has students playing Expression Bingo and collecting a meter a day which can be converted to centimeters, decimeters, decameters and kilometers!

<u>What you can do</u>: Your student has been diligently working on a Problem a Day Calendar at home each night Thank you for helping them take on these challenges. When they get stuck, encourage them to act as a mathematician:

- Mathematicians look for and make use of patterns. -
- Mathematicians draw models and show work.
- Mathematicians read directions carefully.
- Mathematicians ask,"Does this makes sense?"
